  - D.R.A.(K-2 Reading Assessment): Parent Teacher Conferences
4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Parents may consult with staff at parent conferences, before school and after school by appointment.
5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class and to observe classroom activities, as follows:
  - Parents may participate in their child's class and observe classroom activities by setting up an appointment to do so
